The Foundation for Co-Existence created a citizen-based conflict early warning system in Sri Lanka in response to the 2002 ceasefire agreement ending a thirty-year civil war. This system “relied heavily on local expertise and comprised local actors who monitored, evaluated, and implemented activities within the zone.” By using local expertise, practitioners were able to quickly navigate a rapidly changing conflict. This was extremely helpful because “a considerable amount of information became inaccurate by the time it was written into reports for formal dissemination.”
